DECISION

ÉCOLE POLYTECHNIQUE NON-POWER REACTOR OPERATING LICENCE

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission, pursuant to section 24 of the *Nuclear Safety and Control Act*, issues Non-Power Reactor Operating Licence (PERFP-9.00/2006) for a Sub-critical research reactor to the École polytechnique, Montréal, Québec. The licence is valid from July 1, 2000 to June 30, 2006 unless suspended, amended, revoked or replaced.

In reaching this decision the Commission considered the information and submissions of Commission staff and the participants as set out in the material available for reference on the record file as well as the submissions provided or made by the participants at the hearing. The Commission found the facts to be as set out in CMD 00-H9 and agreed with the submissions, statements of law, conclusions and recommendations set out in that document. As a result of that information, the Commission was of the opinion that the applicant satisfies the requirements of section 24 of the *Nuclear Safety and Control Act*.
